Due to the species specific mode of action, the effects are not expected to occur in humans. IARC (International Agency for Research on Cancer) has classified this substance as group 2B (The agent is possibly carcinogenic to humans). In long-term studies in rats and mice in which the substance was given by feed, a carcinogenic effect was not observed.
